## CHEMICALS AND ALLIED PRODUCTS

## PRELIMINARY SUMMARY STATISTICS， 1935.

Preliminary figures for 1935 indicate that the production of chemicals and a）lied products in that year was valued at $\$ 116,351,015$ at factory prices．This total，which was higher than in any year since 1930，was about 7.7 per cent above the 1934 value of $\$ 108,052,039$ and 20.2 per cent above the corresponding figure of $\$ 92,820,761$ in 1933．The gain in employment over 1934 was 9.8 per cent and the increase in salaries and wages was 12.5 per cent．

The improvement in 1935 was quite general with 11 of the industries showing substantial advances and 3 reporting small declines．The gains were as follows：－ coal tar distillation， 30 per cent to $\$ 2,617,681$ ；acids，alkalies and salts， 11 per cent to $\$ 18,367,119$ ；compressed gases， 10 per cent to $\$ 3,082,765$ ；fertilizers， 9 per cent to $\$ 5,947,909$ ；medicinals， 7 per cent to $\$ 20,829,226$ ；paints， 8 per cent to $\$ 20,031,400$ ；soaps， 17 per cent to $\$ 16,076,959$ ；inks， 14 per cent tó $\$ 2,748,512$ ；wood distillation， 4 per cent to $\$ 804,110$ ；adhesives， 12 per cent to $\$ 1,462,962$ ；and polishes， 8 per cent to $\$ 2,066,680$ ．The value of explosives，etc．，at $\$ 8,551,514$ was 5 per cent less than in 1934 ；toilet preparations declined 1 per cent to $\$ 5,917,599$ and the miscellaneous industry decreased 4 per cent to $\$ 7,846,579$ ．

The number of operating establishments in 193．was 740 compared with 736 in 1934 ；the number of employees rose to 18,804 from 17,130 ，and salaries and wages in－ creased $\$ 2.6$ millions to $\$ 23,541,803$ ．Capital employed was slightly less in 1935 at $\$ 154,589,350$ 。

About 53 per cent of the factories，or 395，were located in the province of Ontario；their production totalled $\$ 7,711,840$ or 58 per cent of the Canada total and their employees numbered 9，779 or 52 per cent of the total．Quebec＇s 221 establishments gave work to 6,836 persons and made products worth $\$ 34,592,527$ ．

Canada：imports of chemicals and allied products totalled $\$ 29,757,570$ in 1935 ，or $\$ 1.6$ millions more than in 1934．About 21.3 per cent，or $\$ 6,330,811$ ，came from the United Kingdom and 58．7 per cent，or $\$ 17,458,742$ ，from United States．

Exports in 1935 reached the highest value since 1930 and the total of $\$ 16,372,476$ accounted for about 15 per cent of the production．United States was the chief purchaser，taking 48.7 per cent of the total，and the United Kingdom was next with 18.5 per cent．The value of shipments to United States was $\$ 7,983,454$ and to the United Kingdom，$\$ 3,022,098$ ．
