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CHEMICAL AND CHEMICAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRIES (formerly "Chemicals and Allied Products")

Preliminary Summary Statistics - 1960

Data for 1960 presented in this report reflect implementation of the revised Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) which is being used by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in its compilation of 1960 industry statistics. The revised classification provides for a breakdown of the Chemical group into 10 separate industries under the new title of Chemical and Chemical Products Industries. The latter generally corresponds to the group formerly presented as Chemical and Allied Products with the one exception of the Vegetable Oils Industry which was transferred out of the chemical group to the Foods and Beverage Industries group in the revised Standard Industrial Classification (SIC). Of course, implementation of the new classification introduced, as well, a number of intra-industry changes within the group. These are detailed out in footnote A below.

Pactory shipments reported by the Chemical and Chemical Products Industries group in 1960 were valued at \$1,351.3 millions, an increase of about \$30.7 millions or about 2 per cent over the comparable 1959 total of \$1,320.6 millions (the latter being adjusted to a basis comparable to 1960 by the deletion of the Vegetable Oils Industry).

In 1960, there were 1,137 operating establishments in this group and they employed 53,816 persons who were paid \$252.3 millions in salaries and wages. Materials for use in manufacturing cost \$571.1 millions and fuel and electricity cost \$54.6 millions.

Imports of Chemicals and Allied Products totalled \$338.6 millions during 1960 compared with \$326.9 millions in the previous year. Exports during 1960 totalled \$237.7 millions compared with \$201.7 in 1959.

Note:

- A. Attention is drawn to the fact that the 1960 compilations as presented in this report are on the basis of the revised Standard Industrial Classification (SIC). On this account, totals as shown for 1960 are not exactly comparable with those shown for this group in earlier years. Some of the significant changes are as follows:
 - 1. Transfer of the Vegetable Oils Industry to the Foods and Beverage Industries group.

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- 2. Transfer of firms manufacturing fertilizer materials such as ammonium nitrate, ammonium phosphate, etc., from the Fertilizers Industry (old basis) to the new SIC industry, Manufacturers of Industrial Chemicals. Manufacturers of superphosphate will continue to be classified to the new SIC industry, Manufacturers of Mixed Fertilizers along with firms manufacturing mixed fertilizers.
- 3. The abolition of the Coal Tar Distillation Industry, the Compressed Gases Industry, Adhesives Industry and Polishes and Dressing Industry as separate industries. Details formerly presented for the Compressed Gases Industry will now be included as part of the new SIC industry, Manufacturers of Industrial Chemicals. The other industries mentioned in this paragraph will be included in the new SIC industry, Other Chemical Industries, N.E.S.
- 4. Details relating to the manufacture of writing inks will now be included as part of the new SIC industry, Other Chemical Industries, N.E.S.; however, printing inks will be covered separately in a new SIC sub-division, Manufacturers of Printing Inks.
- 5. Statistics relating to the manufacture of synthetic rubber previously included in the Miscellaneous Chemical Products Industry (old basis) will now be included in the new STC industry, Manufacturers of Industrial Chemicals.
- 6. Details relating to the manufacture of explosives, previously presented along with the Miscellaneous Chemical Products Industry (old basis) will now be shown separately in a new SIC industry, Explosives and Ammunition Manufacturers.
- 7. Changes in the following industries resulting from the implementation of the new SIC may be generally considered as minimal. Manufacturers of Pharmaceutical and Medicines (formerly the Medicinal and Pharmaceutical Preparations Industry); Paint and Varnish Manufacturers (formerly the Paints, Varnishes and Lacquers Industry); Manufacturers of Soap and Cleaning Compounds (formerly the Soaps, Washing Compounds and Cleaning Preparations Industry); Manufacturers of Toilet Preparations (formerly the Toilet Preparations Industry).
- B. Industry bulletins carrying final figures for 1960 which will be available later will present 1957, 1958 and 1959 data re-compiled on the revised SIC basis for purposes of comparability.
