Preliminary Summary Statistics - 1963

As a result of changes brought about by the introduction of the new Standard Industrial Classification in 1960, and further, by changes in reporting procedures based on the new "establishment" concept (both reviewed in previous reports) the statistics for the period 1957-1963 as presented in Table 1, Section B of this report are not exactly comparable with those published for 1959 and earlier years shown in Table 1, Section A.

The 1962 industry reports will contain details of revisions and differences in comparability will also be accounted for.

Factory shipments reported by the Chemical and Chemical Products Industries group in 1963 were valued at \$1,638.3 millions, an increase of approximately \$94.4 millions or about 6 per cent over the comparable 1962 total of \$1,543.9 millions.

In 1963, there were 1,080 operating establishments in this group and they employed 50,879 persons who were paid \$253.5 millions in salaries and wages. Materials for use in manufacturing cost \$666.7 millions and fuel and electricity cost \$56.1 millions.

Imports of Chemicals and Chemical Products totalled \$410.3 millions during 1963 compared with \$394.7 millions in the previous year. Exports during 1963 amounted to \$272.8 millions compared with \$248.5 millions in 1962.
