Preliminary Summary Statistics - 1966

Factory shipments reported by the Chemical and Chemical Products Industries group in 1966 were valued at \$2,150.7 millions, an increase of approximately \$177.4 millions or about 9.0 per cent over the comparable 1965 total of \$1,973.3 millions.

In 1966, there were 1,145 operating establishments in this group and they employed 73,966 persons (see footnote) who were paid \$450.6 millions in salaries and wages. Materials for use in manufacturing cost \$978.1 millions and fuel and electricity cost \$82.0 millions.

Imports of Chemicals and Chemical Products totalled \$544.9 millions during 1966 compared with \$520.9 millions in the previous year. Exports during 1966 amounted to \$380.4 millions compared with \$342.1 millions in 1965.

As a result of a change in the treatment of head office statistics as well as a change in the method of handling certain classes of sales and other personnel, the figures for number of employees and salaries and wages for the period 1961-66 are not exactly comparable with previous years. For the most part the figures for 1960 and prior years cover only production and office and administrative employees at plant along with some head office employees. The figures for the period 1961-66 reflect a total activity basis and, therefore, include employees in both the manufacturing and non-manufacturing activities at all locations. The regular industry reports for 1962 and subsequent years contain full details on total activity, including sales and other operations.

As a result of changes brought about by the introduction of the new Standard Industrial Classification in 1960, and further, by changes in reporting procedures based on the new "establishment" concept (both reviewed in previous reports) the statistics for the period 1957-66 as presented in Table 1, Section B, of this report are not exactly comparable with those published for 1959 and earlier years shown in Table 1, Section A.
