FINAL SUMMARI STATISTICS - 1340
Production in Canada of chemicals and allied products yas valued at $\$ 293,890,338$ in 1940, according to final figures compiled from Consus of Industry reports for that year. This value, an all-time record, was 27.8 per cent above the corresponding total for 1939.

The principal statistics for the 13 industries in this group are given in the accompanying tables. Each industry showed a substantial increase over 1933, the percentage gains being as follows: Coal tar distillation, 36.4; heavy chemicals, 34.4; compressed gases, 23.1; fertilizers, 14.7; medicinals and pharmaceuticals, 8.8; paints and varnishes, 16.1; soaps and cleaning preparations, 3.5; toilet preparations, 20.0; inks, 10.0; hardmood distillation, 42.0; adhesives, 32.2; polishes, 14.1; and miscellaneous, 45.2.

In 1940 there were 804 factories in operation in this group, representing an investment in fixed and working capital of $\$ 213,6$ millions and employing 27,682 workers. About $\$ 82.5$ millions were spent on materials for manufacturing, $\$ 38.6$ millions for salaries and wages, and $\$ 7.2$ millions for fuel and electricity.

About 53 per cent of the production was from Ontario with 430 establishments and output valued at $\$ 103,450,392$. Quebec with 246 factories and production worth $\$ 66,307,107$ accounted for 34 per cent, and British Columbia with 46 plants and output at $\$ 12,744,521$ accounted for 6 per cent of the total.

New records mere established in 1940 for both imports and exports of chemicals and allied products. Imports rose 18.6 per cent to $\$ 51,824,059$, of which $\$ 41.5$ millions was supplied by the United States and $\$ 7.5$ millions by the United Kingdom. Exports increased 28.7 per cent to $\$ 31,222,806$.
