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CHEMICALS AND ALLIED PRODUCTS

FINAL SUMMARY STATISTICS - 1946

Final statistics for 1946 place the output value for the chemicals and allied products group of industries at \$376.3 millions compared with \$478.5 millions in 1945, a decline of about 21 per cent, which was due entirely to the closing of shell-filling plants and works which made special chemicals for use in military explosives. The 1946 value was more than double the best pre-war total of \$156 millions attained in 1939.

A total of 1,021 establishments were included in this group in 1946, and an average of 37,278 workers were employed. About \$159 millions were expended for materials for manufacturing, \$13 millions for fuel and electricity, and \$66 millions for salaries and wages. The 538 works in Ontario accounted for 54 per cent of the total production, and the 327 establishments in Quebec accounted for 33 per cent.

Eight of the industries showed gains in output compared with 1946, and 5 showed losses. The percentage increases were as follows: fertilizers, 44.9; medicinals, 11.1; paints, 17.2; soaps, 3.0; toilet preparations, 5.9; inks, 24.0; adhesives, 25.1, and polishes, 18.1. The declines were: coal tar distillation, 1.9 per cent; compressed gases, 1.4; heavy chemicals, 29.9; wood distillation, 29.0; and miscellaneous, including plastics, 66.6 per cent.

Imports of chemicals and allied products totalled \$92.9 millions in 1946 compared with \$79.7 millions in 1945. Exports were valued at \$67.6 millions in 1946 and \$111.3 millions in 1945.
