THE BROOM, BRUSH AND MOP INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1932.

A report on the Broom, Brush and Mop Industry in Canada during the calendar year 1932 is presented herewith. There were eighty-two establishments in operation which were located by provinces as follows: Prince Edward Island one, Nova Scotia one, New Brunswick one, Quebec twenty-seven, Ontario forty, Manitoba three, Saskatchewan one, Alberta one and British Columbia seven. To avoid divulging information concerning individual establishments, it has been necessary to combine statistics for the provinces of Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick which are shown throughout the report as "Maritime Provinces". Similar procedure has been adopted regarding Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, these being shown as "Prairie Provinces".

These eighty-two factories had a total capital investment of \$3,831,288, provided employment for 1,339 persons who received \$1,083,127 in salaries and wages. The sum of \$1,254,648 was expended for materials used, whilst the total output was valued at \$2,950,076. The value added by the process of manufacture being \$1,695,428.

The principal items of production in order of importance as represented by the total selling value at the factory were: corn brooms \$953,255, paint brushes \$579,512, mops of all kinds \$221,386, brushes made from corn or fibre \$214,885, brushes for household uses \$174,941 and tooth brushes \$141,810.

Decreases over the previous year were recorded in the capital invested to the extent of \$98,583, salaries and wages \$151,316, number of employees eight, materials used \$247,632, value of products \$820,388 and value added by manufacture \$572,756.

Detailed statistics of production, materials used, capital, employment, power and fuel consumption, imports and exports are given in the tables following.

Size of Establishments.

In view of the tendency towards concentration in industrial enterprises, a series of tables has been prepared presenting in a threefold way the size of establishments in the broom, brush and mop industry measured by (a) capital investment, (b), gross value of production and (c) the number of persons employed. The tables compared for a number of years indicate the movement of capital, production and employment within the industry.

In 1932, the number of establishments reporting was eighty-two with a total capitalization of \$3,831,288, a gross value of production of \$2,950,076 and a total employment of 1,339. Nine factories had a total capital investment of \$2,587,272, or 67.6 per cent of the total capitalization, with an average investment of \$287,475 per establishment. Eight establishments had a gross value of production of \$1,601,398, or 54.3 per cent of the total output, with an average production of \$200,175 per establishment. In employment, seven factories had 613 persons on the payroll, an average of eighty-eight persons per establishment and 45.8 per cent of the total employment.
