THE BROOM BRUSH AND MOP INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1933.

A report on the broom, brush and mop industry in Canada during the calendar year 1933 is presented herewith. There were eighty-one establishments in operation which were located by provinces as follows: Prince Edward Island one, Nova Scotia one, New Brunswick one, Quebec twenty-seven, Ontario thirty-nine, Manitoba three, Saskatchewan one, Alberta one and British Columbia seven. To avoid divulging information concerning individual establishments, it has been necessary to combine statistics for the provinces of Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick which are shown throughout the report as "Maritime Provinces". Similar procedure has been adopted regarding Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, these being shown as "Prairie Provinces".

These eighty-one factories had a total capital investment of \$3,724,636, provided employment for 1,374 persons who received \$1,033,983 in salaries and wages. The sum of \$1,089,807 was expended for materials used, whilst the total output was valued at \$2,713,776. The value added by the process of manufacture being \$1,623,969.

The principal items of production in order of importance as represented by the total selling value at the factory were: corn brooms \$812,090, paint brushes \$474,840, mops of all kinds \$286,687, brushes for household use \$214,272, brushes made of corn or fibre \$164,386 and tooth brushes \$164,348.

Decreases over the previous year were recorded in the capital invested to the extent of \$106,652, salaries and wages \$49,144, materials used \$164,841, value of product \$236,300 and value added by manufacture \$71,459. The number of employees, however, was increased by thirty-five.

Detailed statistics of production, materials used, capital, employment, power and fuel consumption, imports and exports are given in the tables following.

Size of Establishments

In view of the tendency towards concentration in industrial enterprises, a series of tables has been prepared presenting in a threefold way the size of establishments in the broom, brush and mop industry measured by (a) capital investment, (b) gross value of production and (c) the number of persons employed. The tables compared for a number of years indicate the movement of capital, production and employment within the industry.

In 1933 the number of establishments reporting was eighty-one with a total capitalization of \$3,724,636, a gross value of production of \$2,713,776 and a total employment of 1,374. Ten factories had a total capital investment of \$2,541,137 or 68.2 per cent of the total capitalization, with an average investment of \$254,113 per establishment. Six establishments had a gross value of production of \$1,279,544 or 47.1 per cent of the total output, with an average production of \$213,257 per establishment. In employment eight factories had 702 persons on the payroll, an average of eighty-eight persons per establishment and 51.1 per cent of the total employment.
