THE BROOM, BRUSH AND MOP INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1935.

A report on the broom, brush and mop industry in Canada during the calendar year 1935 is presented herewith.

There were seventy-eight establishments in operation which were located by provinces as follows: - New Brunswick 1, Quebec 29, Ontario 37, Manitoba 3, Saskatchewan 1 and British Columbia 7. To avoid divulging information concerning individual establishments, it has been necessary to combine statistics for the provinces of New Brunswick and Saskatchewan which are shown throughout the report as "Other Provinces".

These seventy-eight factories had a total capital investment of \$4,091,164, provided employment to 1,417 persons who received \$1,137,955 in salaries and wages. The sum of \$1,548,433 was expended for materials used, whilst the total output was valued at \$3,461,474.

The principal items of production in order of importance as represented by the total selling value at the factory were: - corn brooms \$1,116,954, paint brushes \$650,588, brushes for household use \$266,191, mops, all kinds \$231,062, hair brushes \$162,073, brushes made of corn or fibre \$139,312.

Compared with the previous year there was an increase of \$377,726 in the capital invested, 67 in the number of employees and \$104,295 in the salaries and wages paid. An increase of \$220,928 is shown in the cost of materials used and \$340,993 in the gross value of the products.

The value of the imports of products made and materials used by the industry was \$1,183,438 in 1935 as compared with \$1,088,449 in 1934. Tooth brushes and toilet brushes together formed the greatest item and were valued at \$154,689 in 1935. Broom corn and bristles valued at \$688,866 were the chief raw materials imported.

Exports of this industry in 1935 were valued at \$102,564 of which \$81,154 represented the value of the brushes of all kinds.

Detailed statistics of production, materials used, capital, employment, power and fuel consumption, imports and exports are given in the tables following.

Size of Establishments

In view of the tendency towards concentration in industrial enterprises, a series of tables has been prepared presenting in a threefold way the size of establishments in the broom, brush and mop industry measured by (a) capital investment, (b) gross value of production and (c) the number of persons employed. The tables compared for a number of years indicate the movement of capital, production and employment within the industry.

THE BROOM, BRUSH AND MOP INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1935

In 1935 the number of establishments reporting was seventy-eight with a total capitalization of \$4,091,164, a gross value of production of \$3,461,474 and a total employment of 1,417. Nine factories had a total capital investment of \$2,733,947 or 66.8 per cent of the total capitalization, with an average investment of \$303,772 per establishment. Ten establishments had a gross value of production of \$2,100,201 or 60.7 per cent of the total output, with an average production of \$210,020 per establishment. In employment nine factories had 769 persons on the payroll, an average of eighty-five persons per establishment and 54.3 per cent of the total employment.
