

THE BROOM, BRUSH AND MOP INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1944.

A report on the broom, brush and mop industry in Canada during the calendar vear 1944 is presented herewith.

In that year there were 86 establishments in operation which were located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia 1, New Brunswick 1, Quebec 33, Ontario 38, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 1, Alberta 1, and British Columbia 5. To avoid divulging information concerning individual establishments, it has been necessary to combine statistics for the provinces of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Saskatchewan and Alberta which are shown throughout the report as "Other Provinces."

These 86 factories provided employment to 2,164 persons who received \$2,922,625 in salaries and wages. The sum of \$3,973,756 was expended for materials used, whilst the total output was valued at \$8,997,406.

The industry operated on a reduced scale during 1944. Compared with the previous year there were decreases of 72 in the number of persons employed, \$352,784 in the gross value of production, and \$565,630 in the cost of materials used. There was a drop of 65,378 dozen in the output of brooms of all kinds, although the number of brushes produced was 720,359 dozen higher. Judging by the value of the brushes produced, the increased volume was attained through the production of lower priced articles. This situation no doubt was due to the difficulties of obtaining sufficient and proper materials during the war years.

Detailed statistics of production, materials used, employment, power and fuel consumption are given in the tables following.
