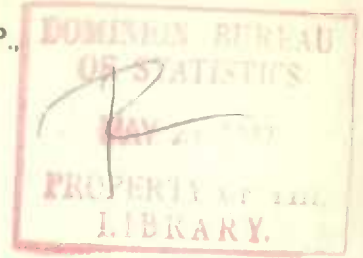

THE BROOM, BRUSH AND MOP INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1945

A report on the broom, brush and mop industry in Canada during the year 1945 is presented herewith.

In that year there were 85 establishments in operation which were located by provinces as follows: Nova Scotia 1, New Brunswick 1, Quebec 32, Ontario 38, Manitoba 5, Saskatchewan 2, Alberta 1, and British Columbia 5. To avoid divulging information concerning individual establishments, it has been necessary to combine statistics for the provinces of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Saskatchewan and Alberta which are shown throughout the report as "Other Provinces."

These 85 factories provided employment to 2,340 persons who received \$3,024,400 in salaries and wages. The sum of \$4,418,618 was expended for materials used, whilst the total output was valued at \$10,188,372.

The industry operated on an increased scale during 1945. Compared with the previous year there were increases of 176 in the number of persons employed, \$1,190,966 in the gross value of production, and \$444,862 in the cost of materials used. There was an increase of 22,196 dozen in the output of brooms of all kinds, while the number of brushes produced was 305,089 dozen higher.

Paint brushes numbering 592,308 dozen and valued at \$2,510,422 was the main item of production in 1945, followed by corn brooms with 263,294 dozen valued at \$1,788,176. Mops of all kinds valued at \$847,312 ranked third and tooth brushes at \$624,773 came fourth. For complete details of products made see Table 3.

Detailed statistics of production, materials used, employment, power and fuel consumption are given in the tables following.
