




THE BROOM, BRUSH AND MOP INDUSTRY

1950

In 1950 reports were received from ninety establishments primarily engaged in the manufacture of brooms, brushes and mops. These establishments produced goods with a selling value at factory of \$16,222,134, gave employment to 2,426 persons who were paid the sum of \$4,456,795 in salaries and wages, and consumed materials costing \$7,352,157. They were located as follows: Newfoundland 1, Nova Scotia 1, New Brunswick 1, Quebec 36, Ontario 37, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 2, Alberta 1, and British Columbia 5.

The industry operated at a level considerably higher than that of 1949. The gross value of production was greater by \$1,390,145, or approximately 9 per cent. Employment was provided for practically the same number of persons while \$224,546 or 5.3 per cent was added to the industry's payroll. The amount expended for materials rose by \$1,025,141 or 16.2 per cent, and the value added by manufacture was \$356,679.

Paint brushes numbering 472,185 dozen and valued at \$3,994,539 was the leading item of production in 1950. Other main items of production in order of importance were corn brooms with 269,887 dozen valued at \$2,700,627, brushes for household use valued at \$1,621,313, and brushes for industrial use valued at \$1,151,168. For complete details of products see Table 3.

As may be observed in Table 9, of the 90 establishments reporting the 7 largest were responsible for a production of \$8,737,819, or approximately 54 per cent of the total, and they furnished employment to 1,121 persons or about 46 per cent of all persons employed in the industry.

Employment in this industry is fairly constant throughout the year. February, with 1913 wage-earners, was the month of highest employment, while July with 1,736 was the month of lowest employment.
