



THE BROOM, BRUSH AND MOP INDUSTRY

1955

Factory shipments in 1955 by establishments in the Broom, Brush and Mop Industry in Canada amounted to \$17,299,701, an increase of \$744,894 or 4.5 per cent over the \$16,554,807 worth of products shipped in 1954. Employment was provided for 2,113 persons, 1 more person than in the previous year. Materials used in manufacturing processes cost \$7,823,119 in 1955, while those used in 1954 were valued at \$7,920,853.

The industry was comprised of 101 establishments in the year under review. Provincially they were distributed as follows: Newfoundland 1, Nova Scotia 1, New Brunswick 1, Quebec 42, Ontario 42, Manitoba 5, Saskatchewan 2, Alberta 1, and British Columbia 6. This distribution indicates the predominant position of two provinces, Ontario and Quebec, whose combined factory shipments accounted for 75 per cent of the total for the industry. These provinces also provided 74 per cent of the total employment. Of the two provinces, Ontario, which by itself was responsible for 57 per cent of factory shipments and 51 per cent of employment, was foremost.

Paint brushes numbering 494,464 dozen and valued at \$4,110,203 was the leading commodity in

1955. Shipments of other main commodities in order of importance were corn brooms with 237,037 dozen valued at \$2,788,728, brushes for household use valued at \$1,424,549 and brushes for industrial use valued at \$1,363,180. For complete details of products shipped see Table 4.

As may be observed in Table 10, of the 101 establishments reporting the 8 largest were responsible for shipments of \$9,477,385 or 55 per cent of the total, and they furnished employment to 1,001 persons or over 47 per cent of all persons employed in the industry.

Employment in this industry is fairly constant throughout the year. November, with 1,732 wage-earners, was the month of highest employment, while July with 1,562 was the month of lowest employment.

Beginning with 1954, information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses is being collected as part of the Annual Census of Industry. This data was formerly collected by a separate survey. The summarized results for the Broom, Brush and Mop Industry for the year under review will be found in Table 3.
