

THE BROOM, BRUSH AND MOP INDUSTRY 1956

Factory shipments in 1956 by establishments in the Broom, Brush and Mop Industry in Canada amounted to \$18,641,759, an increase of \$1,342,058 or 7.8 per cent over the \$17,299,701 worth of products shipped in 1955. Employment was provided for 2,103 persons, 10 fewer persons than in the previous year. Materials used in manufacturing processes cost \$8,608,934 in 1956 while those used in 1955 were valued at \$7,823,119.

The industry was comprised of 104 establishments in the year under review. Provincially they were distributed as follows: Newfoundland 1, New Brunswick 1, Quebec 43, Ontario 42, Manitoba 6, Saskatchewan 3, Alberta 1, and British Columbia 7. This distribution indicates the predominant position of two provinces, Ontario and Quebec, whose combined factory shipments accounted for 76 per cent of the total for the industry. These provinces also provided 76 per cent of the total employment. Of the two provinces, Ontario, which by itself was responsible for 56 per cent of factory shipments and 52 per cent of employment, was foremost.

Paint brushes numbering 518,140 dozen and valued at \$4,138,274 was the leading commodity in 1956. Shipments of other main commodities in order of importance were corn brooms with 245,293 dozen valued at \$3,006,347, brushes for industrial use valued at \$1,652,210 and brushes for household use valued at \$1,567,373. For complete details of products shipped see Table 4.

As may be observed in Table 10, of the 104 establishments reporting the 8 largest were responsible for shipments of \$10,680,742 or 57 per cent of the total, and they furnished employment to 1,031 persons or over 49 per cent of all persons employed in the industry.

Employment in this industry is fairly constant throughout the year, November, with 1,680 wage-earners, was the month of highest employment, while July with 1,563 was the month of lowest employment.

Beginning with 1954, information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses is being collected as part of the Annual Census of Industry. This data was formerly collected by a separate survey. The summarized results for the Broom, Brush and Mop Industry for the year under review will be found in Table 3.


