In terms of the revised Standard Industrial Classification and the New Establishment Concept, this industry is defined as comprising those "Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing household, industrial and street-sweeping brooms; household, paint and tooth brushes; floor, dust and dish mops".

The shipments of goods of own manufacture by the industry proper are presented in Table 13 and herein certain products have been deliberately concealed in order that the more important information covering the shipments of these commodities by all industries might be shown in Table 14.

A list of the establishments classified to this industry in the 1966 survey will be found at the end of this report.

NOTE

The detailed "Concepts and Definitions" notes, usually carried each year, have been omitted from this 1966 report for reasons of economy. Reference to these notes may be had by consulting any 1965 report in this series. Failing this, a copy may be obtained free of charge upon application to the Manufacturing and Primary Industries Division of the Bureau.

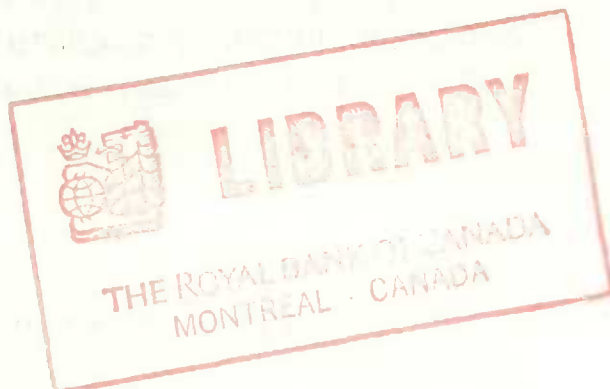

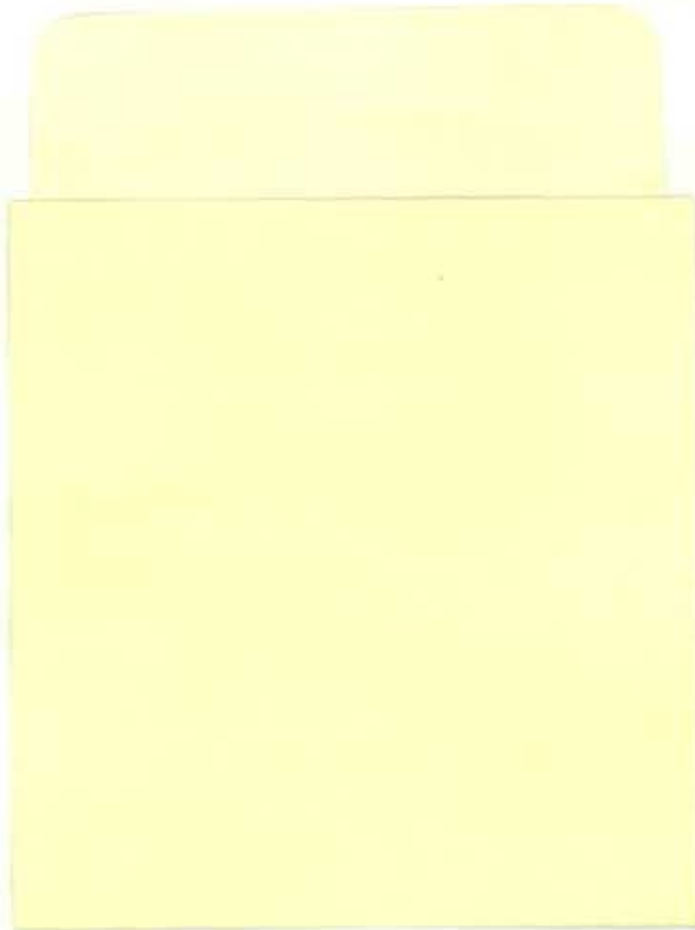
