THE BUTTON INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1938

There were twenty-one establishments in Canada in 1938 engaged principally in the production of buttons, buckles, fasteners, etc. Twelve of these establishments were located in the province of Quebec and nine in Ontario. Goods amounting to \$1,338,583 were produced from materials costing \$498,674 while the 736 persons employed received \$572,858 in salaries and wages.

The operations of the button industry in 1938 were at a lower level. Compared with the previous year there was a reduction of \$251,859 or 15.8 per cent in the gross value of production, 103 in the number of persons employed and \$97,956 in the amount of salaries and wages paid. The physical volume of production was also lower.

Buttons, of plastic materials to the value of \$335,295 was the most important single item of production in 1938, followed by pearl and fresh water pearl buttons valued at \$311,389 and vegetable ivory buttons at \$178,768. These items represent respectively 25.0, 23.2 and 13.3 per cent of the total value of production.

Referring to Table 4 it may be noted that 6 establishments represented a capital investment of \$1,270,123 or 80 per cent of the total. These establishments produced goods valued at \$984,899 or 74 per cent of the total and employed 507 persons or 69 per cent of the total number employed in the industry.

Employment in this industry is fairly uniform throughout the year, there being no marked seasonal variations. Of the wage-earners employed in 1938, 373 or 60.9 per cent were males, as compared with a male employment of 431 or 60.4 per cent of the total wage-earners in 1937. The average salary in 1938 amounted to \$1,766, \$99 more than in 1937, and the average wage paid in 1938, \$578 was \$68 less than the 1937 average.

The export of buttons is of minor importance in Canada's export trade shipments in 1938, totalling only \$29,299. Imports were much higher but the \$205,218 so recorded in 1938 showed a decrease of \$85,760 over the previous year.
