THE BUTTON INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1939.

There were twenty-four establishments in Canada in 1939 engaged principally in the production of buttons, buckles, fasteners, etc. Fourteen of these establishments were located in the province of Quebec and ten in Ontario. Total production amounted to \$1,697,788. The cost of materials was \$598,352 while the 811 persons employed received \$662,403 in salaries and wages.

The operations of the button industry in 1939 were at a higher level. Compared with the previous year there was an increase of \$359,205 or 26.8 per cent in the gross value of production, 75 in the number of persons employed and \$89,545 in the amount of salaries and wages paid. The physical volume of production was also higher.

Buttons, of plastic materials to the value of \$443,357 was the most important single item of production in 1939, followed by pearl and fresh water pearl buttons valued at \$311,761 and metal buttons at \$221,923. These items represent respectively 26.1, 18.3 and 13.0 per cent of the total value of production.

Referring to Table 4 it may be noted that 6 establishments represented a capital investment of \$1,417,823 or 76 per cent of the total. The output of these establishments was valued at \$1,182,114 or 70 per cent of the total and employed 534 persons or 66 per cent of the total number.

Employment in this industry is fairly uniform throughout the year, there being no marked seasonal variations. Of the wage-earners employed in 1939, 435 or 65 per cent were males, as compared with a male employment of 373 or 60.9 per cent of the total wage-earners in 1938. The average salary in 1939 amounted to \$1,636, \$130, less than in 1938, and the average wage paid in 1939, \$643 was \$65 more than the 1938 average.

The export of buttons is of growing importance in Canada's export trade shipments in 1939, totalling \$69,792. Imports were much higher, the \$226,398 so recorded in 1939 showed an increase of \$21,180 over the previous year.




