

THE BUTTON, BUCKLE AND FASTENER INDUSTRY

1949

In 1949 reports were received from thirty-four establishments engaged principally in the production of buttons, buckles, fasteners, etc. Twenty-three of these establishments were located in the province of Quebec and eleven in Ontario. Ontario, however, occupied the leading position in the industry with 58 per cent of the gross value of production and 63 per cent of the number of persons given employment.

Products with a selling value at factory of \$8,006,070 were manufactured in 1949, this representing a decrease of \$1,030,355 or approximately 11 per cent from the previous year. Employment was given to 1,682, 162 or 8.8 per cent fewer than in 1948, while the payroll at \$3,374,644 was practically unchanged. Materials used cost \$3,115,444, an increase of \$37,211 or 1.2 per cent.

Zipper fasteners which were manufactured to a value of \$4,331,479 continued to be the most important item of production. Other main products in order of importance were moulded buttons valued at \$995,627, plastic buttons at \$685,779, metal buttons at \$388,094 and celluloid buttons at \$338,742. For further details of products manufactured, see Table 3.

By referring to Table 9 it will be observed that in 1949 the four largest establishments reported a production of \$4,296,726 or 53.6 per cent of total output. They also reported 955 or 56.8 per cent of the persons employed by the industry.

Employment in this industry is fairly constant throughout the year. October, with 1,476 wage-earners, was the month of highest employment while December, with 1,293, was the lowest. Female wage-earners comprise approximately 54 per cent of the total number employed.
