THE BUTTON, BUCKLE AND FASTENER INDUSTRY

1954

In 1954 reports were received from 44 establishments engaged principally in the production of buttons, buckles, fasteners, etc. Thirty-one of these establishments were located in the province of Quebec and thirteen in Ontario. Ontario, however, occupied the leading position in the industry with 56 per cent of the value of factory shipments and 55 per cent of the number of persons given employment.

The factory selling value of the goods shipped by the industry during the year amounted to \$10,759,859. This was \$694,517 or 6.1 per cent less than that of the previous year. Employment was given to 1,592 persons, which was 149 fewer than in 1953, while the payroll decreased by \$321,704 or 7.2 per cent to \$4,138,450. Materials used cost \$4,420,926, a decrease of \$177,622 or 3.9 per cent from the earlier year.

Zipper fasteners continued to be the industry's most important commodity with shipments valued at \$6,390,352. Shipments of other main commodities in order of importance were moulded buttons valued at \$1,329,427, plastic buttons at \$928,333, metal buttons at \$254,633 and celluloid buttons at \$223,382. For further details of products shipped, see Table 4.

By referring to Table 10 it will be observed that in 1954 the 4 largest establishments reported shipments valued at \$5,954,529 or 55 per cent of the total. They also reported 842 or 53 per cent of all persons employed by the industry.

Beginning with 1954, information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses is being collected as part of the Annual Census of Industry. This data was formerly collected by a separate survey. The summarized results for the Button, Buckle and Fastener Industry for the year under review will be found in Table 3.
