#### THE SPORTING COODS INDUSTRY, 1948

In the reals of sporting activities Canada occupies an enviable position. With abundant forests and streams at the disposal of the hunter and angler it provides an inexhaustible source of recreation and pleasure. In other branches of sport also there are abundant facilities for indulgence in healthy exercise, both indoor and outdoor, for young and old of both sexes, all the year around. In 1948 manufacturers in Canada produced the requisite equipment, supplies and accessories to the extent of almost seven million dollars. To do this required the employment of 1,523 persons whose remuneration amounted to \$2,833,216 and the expenditure of \$3,097,196 for materials and supplies. A comparison of the principal statistics for the years 1937 to 1948 is given in Table 1.

The statistics published in this report refer only to establishments whose principal products consist of sporting goods. Sporting goods are also produced as subsidiary products by establishments credited to other industrial classifications. For this reason the figures given here do not represent the total production of sporting goods in Canada. For complete production statistics reference should be made to the alphabetical list of products published annually in the report "The Manufacturing Industries of Canada".

The number of establishments reporting operations during the year 1948 was 60 and were located by provinces as follows: Quebec 16, Ontario 33, Manitoba 2, Alberta 1 and British Columbia 3. To avoid disclosure of information concerning individual establishments, statistics for the province of Manitoba, Alberta and British Columbia have been combined. Compared with 1947 there was an increase of 36 in the total number of employees and an increase of \$211,644 in the gross value of production. The value of sporting goods produced in 1948 was slightly higher than in 1947 as is shown by Table 2 which gives details of products made. The payroll was higher, requiring an additional \$514,250 while the cost of materials and supplies increased by \$46,631. Due to the fact that, with a few exceptions, separate articles of sporting goods are the output of less than 3 firms, it is not possible to present in detail form the many and varied items comprising sporting goods, but are grouped under the head of that particular branch of sport in which they are used. Bicycles, firearms and ammunition are not included in this report.

The materials entering into the manufacture of sporting equipment supplies and accessories are of such a diversified nature that it is not possible to show them in detail. The total cost during the year 1948 amounted to \$3,097,196.
