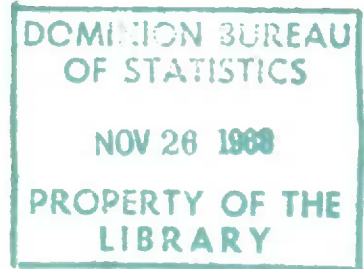

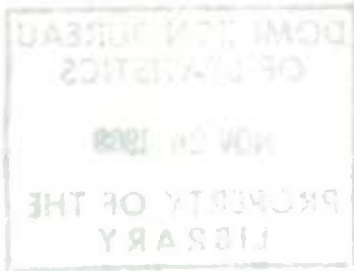

GENERAL INTRODUCTION

- This industrial sub-group comprises the following two industries:
- (a) The Sporting Goods Industry and
 - (b) The Toys and Games Industry.

There is some overlap in terms of the commodities made by the establishments classified to these two industries. The Standard Commodity Classification includes most of the products of the combined industries in one major group entitled "Recreation Equipment, Toys, Games, Sporting and Athletic Goods, n.e.s." and having six sub-groups as follows:

- A. Amusement, park and playground equipment
- B. Sporting equipment (except uniforms and footwear)
- C. Fishing and hunting equipment (except firearms and ammunition)
- D. Games (except amusement, park and playground games)
- E. Toys
- F. Children's vehicles

For the purposes of classifying establishments, sub-groups A,B, and C are regarded as comprising the commodities of the Sporting Goods Industry; whereas these of the Toys and Games Industry are found in sub-groups D,E, and F.

Section 1. Sporting Goods Industry, 1966

In terms of the revised Standard Industrial Classification and the New Establishment Concept, this industry is defined as comprising those "Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing sporting and athletic goods, such as bicycles, fishing tackle, golf and tennis equipment; baseball, football and boxing equipment, skates and equipment for other sports".

Since no detailed information is collected on manufacturing material and supplies used by this industry, Table 12 presents these data with a minimum of breakdown. The Shipments of goods of own manufacture by the industry, given in Table 13 have been abridged in presentation. This has been done in order that the shipments of sporting good commodities by all industries might be shown in as much detail as possible in Table 14.

A list of the establishments classified to this industry in the 1966 survey will be found at the end of this section of the report.

Section 2. Toys and Games Industry, 1966

In terms of the revised Standard Industrial Classification and the New Establishment Concept, this industry is defined as comprising those "Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing toys of all kinds such as tricycles, dolls, wagons, sleighs, and games".

No detailed information is collected on manufacturing materials and supplies used by this industry so that Table 12 presents these data with a minimum of breakdown. Many establishments, not classified to this industry, manufacture toys and games as secondary products. For this reason the shipments of goods of own manufacture in Table 13 have been shown in abridged form in order that the shipments of toys and games by all industries might be presented in Table 14 with as much detail as possible.

A list of the establishments classified to this industry in the 1966 survey will be found at the end of this section of the report.
