THE MISCELLANEOUS INDUSTRIES GROUP, 1930.

The miscellaneous industries group is the smallest of the ten groups into which Canadian manufactures are classified. Industries which are of a mixed nature or do not fit in any of the other nine groups are grouped under this miscellaneous heading. Shipbuilding, production of scientific and professional equipment, musical instruments, mattresses and springs and brooms, brushes and mops are the leading industries of the group. In 1930, establishments classified under the miscellaneous industries group numbered 452. These plants reported a capital investment of \$84,912,229, an employment of 14,328 persons who received \$17,640,108 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$22,508,008 for materials and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$57,966,137, leaving the value added by manufacture at \$35,458,129. The value added by manufacture is obtained by subtracting the cost of the materials used from the gross value of products. This difference represents the value added to the raw materials by labour and it is this value which the manufacturer uses to pay for the labour itself, the overhead expenses and his profits.

The miscellaneous group of industries, in common with all other industrial groups, felt the effects of the general depression prevailing in 1930. Comparisons with 1929 for the group as a whole cannot, however, be made as, in 1930, the bridgebuilding industry was transferred from this group to that of iron and steel products while in the same year the electric signs industry was added to this group. The five leading industries of this group all reported considerable decreases in production, employment and capital invested as the following table shows.

The large drop in the musical instrument industry was due to the fact that the output of pianos, phonographs and phonograph records has been steadily decreasing during the past few years. The main product now of the musical instrument industry, viz. the radio, is mainly produced in the electrical apparatus industry. This industry, however, is credited to the non-ferrous metal products group since by far the larger part of its output consists of industrial equipment and not radios.
