THE MISCELLANEOUS INDUSTRIES GROUP, 1932.

The miscellaneous industries group is the smallest of the ten groups into which Canadian manufactures are classified. Industries which are of a mixed nature or do not fit in any of the other nine groups are grouped under this miscellaneous heading. Shipbuilding, the production of scientific and professional equipment, musical instruments, mattresses and springs and brooms, brushes and mops are the leading industries of the group. In 1932, establishments classified under the miscellaneous industries group numbered 479. These plants reported a capital investment of \$65,600,126, an employment of 11,155 persons who received \$11,822,441 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$11,984,894 for materials and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$33,242,610, leaving the value added by manufacture at \$21,257,716. The value added by manufacture is obtained by subtracting the cost of the materials used from the gross value of the products made. This difference represents the value added to the raw materials by labour and it is this value which the manufacturer uses to pay for the labour itself, the overhead expenses and his profits.

The miscellaneous industries group, in common with all other industrial groups, continued to feel the effects of the prevailing depression. Compared with the previous year, there was a drop in 1932 of \$10,082,635 in the capital investment, 1,666 in the number of people employed and \$3,311,418 in the amount paid out in salaries and wages. The value of the products made was \$12,107,712 lower, while the value added by manufacture also declined by \$6,931,745. All the leading industries of the group reported considerable decreases in production, employment and capital investment as the following table shows.

The continued large drop in the musical instruments industry is due to the steadily decreasing output in recent years of pianos, phonographs and phonograph records. The main product now of the musical instruments industry, viz., the radio, is mainly produced in the electrical apparatus industry. This industry, however, is credited to the non-ferrous metal products group since by far the greater part of its output consists of industrial equipment and not radios.
