## ITDEX NUNBERS OF THOIESALE PRICES TNNE 1928.

The Dominion Burcau of Statistics index number of wholesale prices foll 2.7 points in June being 150.2 as compared with 152.9 in May. 38 price quotations were higher, 43 were lower and 155 were unchanged. Of the eight main groups, throe were higher, three lower and $t$ wo unchanged.

Vegetables and their Products fell from 158.6 to 158.6 due mainly to 2oclines in grains, flour, oat products, potatoes, sugar, tea, hay, strat and vegetable oils. Animals and their Products rose from 138.2 to 141.3 , chicfly becausc of higher leveis for cattle, hogs, beef, smoked meats, lard, boots and shoce and butter. The index for Fibres, Textiles and Textile Products mas again 168.4. Advances in some cotton fabrics and in moollon hosiony moro offsot by declines in silk and jutc. Iron and its Products fell from 141.7 to 140.9 due mainly to slight deslines in steol bars and steel shects. Non-Ferrous Metals rose from 95.7 to for silver levels for copper, lead and spelter more than offsetting lower levels to an advance in anthracite coal. Chemicals Minerals rose from 169.9 to 170.6 orring +0 148.9 chiefly because of coal. Chemicals and Allicd Froducts fell from 150.0 Products nas stationary.
