The Vegetable Products group feil from 90.1 to 88.9 , 2ows: geivea for grains, mill feed, foreign fruits, sugar, potatoes, rublur, naval stores and scme vegetable oils more than offetting higher prices for flour, tea, coffee, arples and hay. Animals and their Products rose from 108.2 to 710.5 due mainly to higher levels for livestock, Leats, fom, butter and cheese. Fibres, Textiles and lutilo Products fell from 93.2 to 92.8 , declines in hessjan, jute and wool more then offsetting advances in cotton, silk, flax fibre, hemp, sisal and manila rope. Tood, Trod Products and Paper rose from 98.2 to 99.2 , due mainly to advances in scme ines of lumber. Iron and its Preducts, chiefly because of advances in scrap iron, leac noved sharply. Non-Ferrous Metals rose from 95.7 to 101.5. Copper and ad Allied Products, due chief spelter and silver advanced slightly. Chemicals from 94.4 to 94.5. Non-lifetallic Minerals and their Promes of paint materials, rose
