INDEX NUMBERS OF SECURITY PRICES, SALES AND VALUES 1926 = 100

"Investor's" and "Trader's" weighted index numbers of security prices computed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the base 1926 = 100 were as follows last week:-

The "Investor's" index of industrial common stocks was 174.7 last week as compared with 171.7 for the week ending January 19th.

The "Trader's" index of prices of the twenty-five best selling industrial and public utility common stocks on the Montreal and Toronto Exchanges was 329.6 last week as compared with 317.0 for the week ending January 19th.

The "Investor's" index of domestic public utility common stocks was 135.8 last week and 135.0 for the week ending January 19th.

The "Investor's" index for common stocks of companies located abroad in which Canadians are heavily interested was 145.3 last week and 145.6 for the week ending January 19th.

Average prices were higher for twenty-four and lower for one of the twenty-five stocks. Laurentide rose from \$128.9 to \$132.3, International Nickel from \$93.1 to \$96.0, Massey-Harris from \$42.8 to \$45.0, Brazilian from \$214.8 to \$220.0, Abitibi from \$149.6 to \$159.3, St. Maurice Valley Corporation from \$87.8 to \$95.0, Winnipeg Electric from \$104.3 to \$111.8 and Brompton from \$56.3 to \$62.3. Dominion Bridge fell from \$73.4 to \$70.2.

Sales were greater for twenty and lower for five stocks. Consolidated Smelters went up from 3,500 to 26,300, Massey-Harris from 58,000 to 119,600, Brazilian from 17,100 to 28,000, International Nickel from 79,200 to 103,900, Page-Hersey from 6,000 to 22,500, Charles Gurd from 800 to 14,600, Abitibi from 10,400 to 18,300, National Breweries from 4,200 to 15,200 and Brompton from 10,500 to 22,700. Laurentide dropped from 56,500 to 22,000, Montreal Power from 8,200 to 5,900 and St. Maurice Valley Corporation from 11,900 to 8,700.

Purpose of Trader's and Investor's Index Number

The Investor's index numbers measure the trend of values for the investor who buys a fixed list of stocks and holds them over a long period.

The Trader's index measures the trend of gains or losses for an "average" trader on the Montreal and Toronto stock exchanges, who buys and sells the leading common stocks in the same proportion as they are traded in the market as a whole, and who turns over his investments every week.
