Chief, Internal Trade Branch: INVESTORS' AND TRADERS' INDEX NUMBERS OF SECURITY PRICES 1926 = 100 "Investors'" and "Traders'" weighted index numbers of security prices, computed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the base 1926 = 100, were as follows for the week ending August 2nd. The "Investors" index of industrial common stocks was 168.9 for the week ending August 2nd as compared with 169.1 for the previous week. The "Traders'" index of prices of the twenty-five best selling industrial and public utility common stocks, on the Montreal and Toronto Exchanges, was 386.3 for the week ending August 2nd as compared with 386.2 for the previous week.

The "Investors" index of domestic utility common stocks was 139.2 for the week ending August 2nd as compared with 139.0 for the previous week.

The "Investors'" index for common stocks of companies located abroad in which Canadians are heavily interested was 146.6 for the week ending August 2nd as compared with 148.0 for the previous week.

The "Investors'" index for all three groups of common stocks combined was 154.8 for the week ending August 2nd as compared with 155.0 for the previous week.

Average weekly prices were higher for three and lower for twenty-two of the twenty-five stocks. International Nickel rose from \$92.9 to \$96.7. Lyall declined from \$65.5 to \$53.8, Brazilian from \$55.4 to \$54.0, Canadian Power and Paper from \$35.4 to \$33.5, Shawinigan from \$90.2 to \$88.9, Steel of Canada from \$190.9 to \$184.4, Winnipeg Electric from \$110.7 to \$108.3, National Breweries from \$124.3 to \$122.6, Montreal Light and Power from \$106.2 to \$104.2, Power Corporation from \$71.1 to \$67.3 and Quebec Power from \$86.7 to \$84.7.

Sales were greater for eighteen and lower for seven stocks. International Nickel fose from 30,700 to 95,000, Brazilian from 20,700 to 36,000, Abitibi from 2,100 to 13,100. Consolidated Mining and Smelting from 1,100 to 2,500, National Breweries from 1,100 to 2,700 and Lyall from 1,700 to 4,400. Canadian Fawer and Paper fell from 14,900 to 6,200 and Shawinigan from 8,600 to 6,400.

## Purpose of Traders' and Investors' Index Number

The investors' index numbers measure the trend of values for the investor who buys a fixed list of stocks and holds them over a long period.

The traders' index measures the trend of gains or losses for an "average" trader on the Hontreal and Toronto Stock Exchanges, who buys and sells the leading common stocks in the same proportion as they are traded in the market as a whole, and who turns over his investments every week.
