The "Traders" index of prices of the twenty-five best selling industrial and piblic utility common stocks, on the Montreal and Toronto Exchanges, was 1186.0 for the week ending october 10 th, as compared rith 1255.4 for the previous meek.

The "Investors" indax of domestic utility common stocks was 155.8 for the week ending october 10 th, as compared with 159.5 for the previous week.

The "Investors:" index of comon stocks of companies located abroad in which Canadians are heavily interested was 190.4 for the week ending october 10th, as compared with 195.5 for the previous week.

The "Investors:" index for all three grouns of comon stocks combined was 220.1 for the week ending October 20 th, as compared with 227.7 for the previous week.

Average weekly prices were lower for twenty-three and higher for two of the twenty-five stocks. Grazilian fell from \$73.2 to \$58.4. International Nickel. from $\$ 56.6$ to $\$ 52,7$, Montreal Light, Heet and Pemer from $\$ 170.3$ to $\$ 166.0$, Shaminigan from $\$ 102.3$ to $\$ 100.4$. Walkers from $\$ 1508$ to $\$ 1406$, Dcminion Bridge from $\$ 106.9$ to $\$ 103.4$, Winnipeg Electric from $\$ 81.1$ to $\$ 16.2$, McColl 0 Frontenac Oil from $\$ 36,0$ to $\$ 34.2$.
