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INVESTORS AND TRADERS INDEX NUMBERS OF SECURITY PRICES 1926±300

"Investors'" and "Traders!" weighted index numbers of security prices, computed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the base of 1926=100, were as follows for the week ending October 10th.

The "Investors!" index of industrial common stocks was 285.8 for the week ending October 10th, as compared with 298.1 for the previous week.

The "Traders!" index of prices of the twenty-five best selling Industrial and public utility common stocks, on the Montreal and Toronto Exchanges, was 1186.0 for the week ending October 10th, as compared with 1255.4 for the previous week.

The "Investors!" index of domestic utility common stocks was 155.8 for the week ending October 10th, as compared with 159.5 for the previous week.

The "Investors:" index of common stocks of companies located abroad in which Canadians are heavily interested was 190.4 for the week ending October 10th, as compared with 195.5 for the previous week, THE REPORT OF THE PARTY OF THE

Average weekly prices were lower for twenty-three and higher for two of the twenty-five stocks. Brazilian fell from \$73.2 to \$58.4. International Nickel from \$56.6 to \$52.7, Montreal Light, Heat and Power from \$170.3 to \$166.0, Shawinigan from \$102.3 to \$100.4, Walkers from \$15.8 to \$14.6, Dominion Bridge from \$106.9 to \$103.4, Winnipeg Electric from \$81.1 to \$76.2, McColl-Frontenac Oil from \$36.0 to \$34.2. Massey Harris from \$50.9 to \$49.5, Power Corporation from \$119.0 to \$117.4, National Steel Car from \$78.2 to \$74.1 and Canada Power and Paper from \$31.5 to \$30.4. Famous Players rose from \$63.0 to \$64.3.

Sales were higher for seventeen and lower for eight stocks. Montreal Light, Heat and Power went up from 17,000 to 22,500, Power Corporation from 5,900 to 9,800, Dominion Bridge from 4,800 to 9,000, International Nickel from 222,700 to 9,800, Dominion Bridge from 4,800 to 9,000, International Nickel from 222,700 to 228,100, Winnipeg Electric from 1,400 to 4,400, National Steel Car from 1,100 to 3,600, Abitibi from 4,200 to 7,500, Canada Car and Foundry "New" from 3,200 to 8,100, Quebec Power from 1,800 to 3,300, Massey Harris from 9,300 to 11,900, Page Hersey from 900 to 1,800 and Canada Power and Paper from 10,400 to 12,900. Brazilian declined from 324,400 to 185,600. Shawinigan from 23,700 to 22,500, Walkers from 40,700 to 35,800, McColl-Frontenac Oil from 12,700 to 11,100, Bell Telephone from 1,900 to 1,600 and Consolidated Mining and Smelting from 700 to 600.

The Investors' Index Numbers measure the trend of values for the investor who buys a fixed list of stocks and holds them over a long period.

The Traders! Index measure the trend of gains or losses for a trader on the Montreal and Toronto Exchanges, who buys and sells the leading common stocks in the same proportion as they are traded in the market as a whole, at the nathematical average price of the week and who turns over his investments every week.
