"Investors" and "Traders" weighted index numbers of security prices, comm puted by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the base of $1926=100$, were as follows for the week ending November 21st.

The "Investors"" index of industrial comon stocks was 205.9 for the week ending November 21st, as compared With 195,2 for the previous week.

The "Traders'" index of prices of the twenty-five best selling industrial and public utility common stocks, on the Montreal and Toronto Exchanges, was 774.7 for the week ending November 21st, as compared with 714.8 for the previous week.

The "Investors'" index of domestic utility common stocks was 128.3 for the week ending November 21st, as compared with 125,2 for the previous week.

The "Investors" irdex of common stocks of companies located abroad in which Canadians are heavily interested was 154.6 for the week end ng November 21st, as compared rith 122.5 for the previsus week.

The "Investors1" index for all three groups of common stocks combined was 163.9 for the \%eek ending November 2lst, as comparcd with 155.8 for the previous week.

Average weekly pricos were higher for trenty-farr and lower for one of the trenty-five stocks. Brazilian rose from $\$ 36.4$ to $\$ 41.2$, International Nickel from $\$ 29.2$ to $\$ 31.4$, Muntreal Light, Heat and Power from $\$ 109.1$ to $\$ 115.2$, Dcminion Bridge from $\$ 63.7$ to $\$ 69.4$, National Steel Car from $\$ 32.8$ to $\$ 43.8$, Canada Car and Foundry from $\$ 21.2$ to $\$ 24.1$, Walkers from $\$ 10.1$ to $\$ 11.2$, Shawinigan from $\$ 72.0$ to $\$ 75.8$, Consolidated Mining and Smelting from $\$ 235.7$ to $\$ 255.6$, National Breweries from $\$ 108.8$ to $\$ 114.5$. Canada Power and Paper rom $\$ 20.3$ to $\$ 22.3$ and Famous Players from $\$ 38.5$ to $\$ 42.7$.

Wales were lower for twenty-one and higher for four stocks. International Nickel fell frcm 462,700 to 195,800, Brazilian from 237,300 to 92,900, Montreal Light, Heat and Pcwer from 37,700 to 18,400 , Shawinigan from 30,900 to 13,400 , consolidated Mining and Smeiting from 4100 to 1800 , Dorinion Bridge from 21,400 to 13,900 , Power Corportion from 10,000 to 6000, Walkers from 84,200 to 51,600, Wassey Harris from 16,700 to 11,500 , Steel of Canada fron 7700 to 4200 , National Bremeries from 5600 to 4400, and Quebec Power from 5300 to 3500 . Canada Car and Foundry went up from 13,400 to 22,500 and National Stuel Car from 2900 to 6300 .


Purpose of Traders and Investors i Index Numbers
The Investors' Index Numbers measure the trend of values for the investor who buys a fixed list of stccks and holds them over a long period.

The Traders' Index measure the trend of gains or losses for a trader on the Montreal and ferontc Exchanges, who buys and sells the leading common stocks in the same proportion as they are traded in the market as a whole, at the mathematical average price of the week and who turns over his investments every week.
