## INVESTORS! AND TRADERS! INDEX NUMBERS OF SECURITY PRICES

1926 = 100

"Investors!" and "Traders!" weighted index numbers of security prices, computed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the base of 1926=100, were as follows for the week ending May 16th.

The "Investors!" index of industrial common stocks was 270.2 for the week ending May 16th, as compared with 274.9 for the previous week.

The "Traders'" index of prices of the twenty-five best selling industrial and public utility common stocks, on the Montreal and Toronto Exchanges, was 973.6 for the week ending May 16th, as compared with 1001.5 for the previous week.

The "Investors!" index of domestic utility common stocks was 141.8 for the week ending May 16th, as compared with 144.3 for the previous week.

The "Investors!" index of common stocks of companies located abroad in which Canadians are heavily interested was 165.0 for the week ending May 16th, as compared with 171.0 for the previous week.

The "Investors!" index for all three groups of common stocks combined was 204.2 for the week ending May 16th, as compared with 208.4 for the previous week.

Average weekly prices were lower for nineteen and higher for six of the twenty-five stocks. International Nickel fell from \$53.4 to \$5.12, Brazilian from \$54.9 to \$52.1, Massey Harris from \$73.0 to \$68.1, Dominion Bridge from \$104.4 to \$101.7, Hamilton Bridge from \$63.7 to \$57.0, Ford "A" from \$62.3 to \$60.8, National Steel Car from \$105.7 to \$101.3, Canada Car and Foundry from \$147.1 to \$138.7 and Cockshutt Plow Co. from \$43.3 to \$40.9. Walkers "New" rose from \$19.5 to \$28.1 (including Rights), Canada Bread from \$179.2 to \$198.4 and Dominion Glass from \$179.9 to \$189.1.

Sales were higher for fourteen and lower for eleven stocks. Brazilian went up from 75,400 to 97,600, Dominion Glass from 700 to 1,900, Dominion Bridge from 5,200 to 7,100, Hamilton Bridge from 450 to 2,900, Consumers Gas from 35 to 790, National Steel Car from 2,600 to 3,800, Montreal Light, Heat and Power from 2,100 to 3,000 and Canada Bread from 650 to 1,100. International Nickel declined from 188,600 to 145,900, Ford "A" from 14,300 to 10,700, Cockshutt Plov Co. from 9,400 to 4,400, Walkers "New" from 26,500 to 17,500, Shawinigan from 5,700 to 3,700. Canada Car and Foundry from 2,700 to 1,700 and Canada Power and Paper from 7,600 to 3,700

The Traders' Index measures the trend of gains or losses for at trader on the Montreal and Toronto Exchanges, who buys and wells the leading common stocks in the same proportion as they are traded in the market as a whole, at the nationatical average price of the week and who turns over his investments every week.
