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## INVESTORS' AND TRADERS' INDEX NUMBERS OF SECURITY PRICES 1926=100

"Investors!" and "Traders!" weighted index numbers of security prices, computed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the base of 1926=100, were as follows for the week ending September 12th.

The "Investors!" index of industrial common stocks was 306.3 for the week ending September 12th, as compared with 311.0 for the previous week.

The "Traders!" index of prices of the twenty-five best selling industrial and public utility common stocks, on the Montreal and Toronto Exchanges, was 1210.6 for the week ending September 12th, as compared with 1234.8 for the previous week.

The "Investors!" index of demestic utility common stocks was 160.8 for the week ending September 12th, as compared with 163.6 for the previous week.

The "Investors!" index of common stocks of companies located abroad in which Canadians are heavily interested was 191.8 for the week ending September 12th, as compared with 199.4 for the previous week.

The "Investors!" index for all three groups of common stocks combined was 230.9 for the week ending September 12th, as compared with 235.4 for the previous week.

Average weekly prices were lower for twenty-two and higher for three of the twenty-five stocks. Brazilian fell from \$70.6 to \$07.9, Shawinigan from \$109.1 to \$105.4, International Nickel from \$54.4 to \$54.0, Consolidated Mining and Smelting from \$445.4 to \$411.5, Power Corporation from \$131.7 to \$127.4, Famous Players from \$76.1 to \$75.3, Montreal Light, Heat and Power from \$154.7 to \$153.8, McColl-Frontenac Oil from \$43.9 to \$42.2, Canada Car and Foundry from \$35.8 to \$35.0, Wayagamack from \$100.2 to \$95.9 and Massey Harris from \$58.8 to \$56.8, National Steel Car rose from \$88.3 to \$93.3 and National Breweries from \$146.9 to \$149.5.

Sales were lower for sixteen and higher for nine stocks. Montreal Light, Heat and Power declined from 28,000 to 18,100, Winnipeg Electric from 9,200 to 2,100, McColl-Frontenac Oil from 23,800 to 8,800, Sherwin Williams from 10,100 to 2,600, Dominion Bridge from 10,500 to 7,900, Wayagamack from \$5,200 to 2,800, Power Corporation from 9,300 to 8,000 and Price Bros. from 3,900 to 2,500, International Nickel went up from 65,300 to 168,000, Famous Players from 15,000 to 23,400, Shawinigan from 17,900 to 23,700, National Breweries from 1,800 to 4,400, National Steel Car from 2,400 to 5,900 and Walkers from 12,200 to 19,600.

Purpose of Traders! and Investors! Index Numbers

The Investors! Index Numbers measure the trend of values for the investor who buys a fixed list of stocks and holds them over a long period.

The Traders' Index measures the trend of gains or losses for a trader on the Montreal and Toronto Exchanges, who buys and sells the leading common stocks in the same proportion as they are traded in the market as a whole, at the mathematical average price of the week and who turns over his investments every week.
