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## IIVESTCRS' AD TEADERS' IIDEX NUMBERS OF SECURITY ERICES <br> $1926=100$

"Investors'" and "Traders"" Feighted index numbers of security rices, computed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the base of $1926=100$, were as follows for the week ending August 14 th.

The "Investors"" index of industrial common stocks was 149.4 for the week ending dugust 14 th, as compared with 156.2 for the orevious week.

The "Traders'" index nrices of the twenty-five best selling industrial and rublic utility common stocks, on the Montreal and Toronto Exchanges, was 732.8 for the weak ending August 14 th, as comoared with 771.9 for the previous week.

The "Investors'" index of domestic utility common stocks was 113.3 for the week ending August 14th, as compared with 118.6 for the nrevious week.

The "Investcrsl" index of comon stocks of companies located abroad in which Canadians are heavily interested was 108.8 for the week ending August 14 th, as commared with 114.7 for the revious week.

The "Investors'l" index for all three grouns of common stocks combined was 129.0 for the week ending Aurust 14 th, as conoared with 135.0 for the mrevious week.

Average weokly prices were lower for all of the twenty-five stocks. Brazilian fell from $\$ 36.7$ to $\$ 34.4$, International Nickel from $\$ 23.0$ to $\$ 21.4$ plus Rights, Montreal Light Heat and Power" "New" rom \$57.0 to \$5.2, Consolidated Mining and Smelting from $\$ 198.1$ to $\$ 186.5$, Shawing gan from $\$ 66.9$ to $\$ 64.2, C . P$. R. "New" from $\$ 26.4$ to $\$ 44.1$, Dominion Eridge from $\$ 51.4$ to $\$ 59.7$, Canada Power and Faper from $\$ 13.0$ to $\$ 11.7$, and Fower Cornoration from $\$ 6.9 .7$ to $\$ 56.2$.

Sales were hirier for tyenty-three and lower for two stocks.Brazilian mounted from 18,900 to 64,000, International Nickel from 23.500 to 50,900 , Montreal Light Heat and Power "New" rom 3,100 to 8,500 , C. P. R. "New" from 500 to 5,500 , consolidated Mining and Smelting from 200 to 1,300, Shawinigen from 2,400 to 5,400 , Power Corporstion from 300 to 1, 800 , National Ereweries from 1,100 to 3,300 , Canada Power and Paner from 1,700 to 6,400, and Dominion Eridge from 5,500 to 6,400 . City Dairy declined from 3,500 to 1,700 and Massey Harris from 3,900 to 2,400.


## Furpose of Traders' and Investors' Index Numbers

The Investors' Index Numbers measure the trend of values for the investor who buys a fixed list of stocks and holds them over a long neriod.

The Traders' Index measures the trend of gains or losses for a trader on the Montreal and Toronto Exchanges, who buys and sells the leading common stocks in the same nronortion as they are traded in the market as a whole, at the mathematical average price of the week and who turns over his investments every weok.
