Dapartrient stare sales, in December, 1948, totalled $\$ 109,638,000$ an increase of 18 per cent over sales of $\$ 93.159,000$ reported for December. 1947.

Total sales in 1948 were $14 \%$ higher than 1947. Gains in the western provinces were larger thari in eastern Canada, Alberta leading with a $20 \%$ margin of inareese over 1947 (Page 3)。

## By Selectod Departments

Iarge sales increases in December for apparel, food footwear, household appliances and hardware devartments featured an all-time high Christmas trede. These departments had increases over December, 1947 ranging from $17 \%$ to $22 \%$ The summary of 1048 results shows that the most prominent gains over 1947 were in the departments enumerated above. Sales of radio and music departments were $2 \%$ lower than in 1947 , but all other departments reported increases.

The value of department store inventories at the beginning of December was $16^{\circ}$ above their value on the same date a year previously. The largest increases were in those departments which shared most fully in the a ative December trade.
