## PRELIIINARY REPORT ON DEPLRTMENT STORE SiIES, APRTL, 1941

Department store sales in Canada, stimulated by a brisk Easter trade, moved sharply upwards during hpril. The dollar volume of sales gained 26 per cent over fpril, 1940, while improvement of 19 per cent was recorded over March of this year. Unadjusted indexes (on the base, 1935-1939 equals 100) stood at 132.3 for hpril, 1941, 105.2 for April, 1940 and 111.4 for March, 1941.

After making adjustments for differences in number of business days and for normal seasonal variations, as well as an arbitrary adjustment for the shifting date of Fastor, the index for April was 133.5 , considorably abovo tho 125 lovol about which tho indoxos wore sustainod during the first throo months of this year. The adjustod indox for April was 7 por cont abovo tho 124.8 rocordod in March, 1941, and 26 por cont highor than tho 106.2 shown for April last yoar.

Tho Maritimo Provincos again rocordod a most substantial gain of 43 por cont ovor April, 1940. Incruasos in Ontario and Quobec woro clasoly alliod at 27 and 26 por cont rospoctivoly, whilo gains in tho wostorn provincos woro also similar, an advanco of 21 por cont in tho Prairio Provinces boing followod by a gain of 20 por cont in British Columbia.
