## CHANGEE THM YALTE OF REMALL SALES <br> Jankary 1229 to March 1231

Index Numbers of Retail Sales issued by the Dominion Bureau of Stavistics for March 29 show increased sales for seven groups and lower sales Lor two groups as compared with Pebruary 1931. A combined index for all Eroups rose from 85.7 in Februery tio 99.0 in March, the base being January $1929=100$.

No correction of these index numbers is yet possible for seasonal znflunnces since the period covered is too short. Nor is any allowance made for Drice chens. The fact that the incex mabers are higher in March than in Fobmary is partly seascnal. Tle fact that they are lower in March 1931 than in March 1929 is in part duo to Jowor retaii prices. Nevertheless, when index nurbers for February and March are compared for the three years 1929, 1930 and 1931, it would seem that if iue Ai ? omance pere made for seasonal movements and price chnages, that ir 193...n showec a greater relative gain over February than in 1530 and a smalier roletive gain ther $\ddagger 121929$.

These index munbers are based on returns from 35 chain stores and 2* departmental stores. Inder numbers for groups were as follows:-

Boots and shoes rose from 59.0 in february to 76.1 in March; Clothing from 68.0 to 106.2; Drue sales from 87.7 to 93.1 ; Furniture from 69.6 to 70.1 ; Goneral and dopartment $\mathrm{I}^{2}$ from 88.6 to 104.9; Groceries and meats from 93.0 to 97.9 ; Restaurants from 76.3 to gl. 2 .

Candy showed a dec-ease from 80.1 in Febmary to 75.4 in March, and music ana radio from 73.0 to 69.2 .
