January Salen Declined Fros A Year Ago
The dollar volume of wholesale sales in January, 1950 was $5 \%$ lower than in January a year ago and $11.4 \%$ below the December, 1949 voluse according to etatemente aubmitted by 367 wholesalere repreaenting nine trades. The unadjusted 1 nder for the nine trades (on the base, average for $1935-1939=100$ ) stood at 231.8 for January, 1950 , 243.2 for January, 1949 , and 261.5 for December, 1949.

All regions of the country except the Maritimes shared in the general decilne in bales during January, 1950. Sales in the Prairle Provinces and Ontario were down $4 \%$ from ayear ago, British Columbia, 94, and Quebec asles were 7\% lover in dollar volume. The Maritimes regiatered a fractional gain of $0.6 \%$ over January, 1949.

The two food trades, groceries, and fruits and vegetables, showed minor gains in sales with increases over danuary 1949 of $1.8 \%$ and $0.4 \%$ respectively. The other allied food trade, tobacco and confec= tionery wholesalers, registered a minor decline ( $0.5 \%$ ) in dollar volume of sales from a year ago.

Sales of automotive equipment wholesalers were $7 \%$ bel ow January of last year, drug wholesalers" sales dropped $10 \%$ and hardware declined 15\%. The clothing and dry goods trades showed the greatest decline in dollar volume of sales from January 1949. Footwear wholesalers registered $12 \%$ less sales than a year ago, dry goods wholesalers $16 \%$ less and clothing wholesalers showed the greatest drop of the nine trades at $22 \%$. This January recession in dollar volume of sales in dry goods and clothing wholesalers continues the 1949 dowrward trend in sales of these trades.

Stooks Dropped $4 \%$ in Value from January 1950
The value of wholesalers stocks on hand at the end of January 1950 was $4 \%$ below that at the end of the same month in 1949.

Substantial gains in value of inventory were reported by footwear wholesalers at $16.4 \%$, and by automotive equipment wholesalers at $11.3 \%$. Stocks held by the drug and dry goods trades were $3 \%$ higher in value than at the end of January last year.

While stocks held by hardware wholesalers were only slightly below their year-ago value, the other four wholesal trades recorded inventory decreases of from $6 \%$ to $18 \%$. Tobacco and confectionery wholesalers' stocks were down $6 \%$, and fruit and vegetable wholesalers $10 \%$ below the level of a year ago. The clothing trade had $11 \%$ less stock and the wholessle grocery trade a decrease of $18 \%$ compared with those held at the end of January 1949.

## Stock-Seles Ratio in the Wholesale Grocery Trade

Stocks held by wholesale grocers at the beginning of January are normally $63 \%$ in excess of sales for that month (based on the average for the years 1936-1942). Wholesale grocers' stocks at the beginning of January 1950 were valued $21 \%$ higher than their sales during danus ry.
