October 1950 sales of wholesalers in the nine trades covered by this report were 51 higher than sales in October a year ago but declined seasonally by 34 from September this year. Sales for the first ten months of 1950 were $5 \%$ above the dollar volume for the aam ten-month period of 1949 . The general unadjusted index (on the bs se, average for 1935-1939 =120) stood at 339.7 for October 1950, 214.8 for October 1949 , and 351.5 for September 1950.

Wholesalers in Quebec, as in the past three months, recorded the greatest increase over 1949. Dollar sales in that province were 124 higher than in October a year ago, while rains of $10 \%$ and $9 \%$ were recorded for british Columbia and ontario. Prairie wholesalers' sales were up $5 \%$ and a rein of 24 was registered in wholesale sales in the Maritime Provinces.


The dry goods and apparel trades and hardware wholesalers continued to lead the nine trades surveyed in the rate of increase in dollar volume of sales in October this year compared with last, while the rate of increase in automotive equipment wholesalers' sales was considerably smaller than in the immediately preceding months. Clothing wholesalers' sales were up $20 \%$; dry goods, $16 \%$; and footwear, $15 \%$. Sales of hardware wholesalers were $19 \%$ in excess of the October 1949 volume.

Increases ranging from $1 \%$ to $8 \%$ were reported for the other trades except fruit and vegetable wholesalers where a decline of $4 \%$ from October 1949 was recorded.

## Stosks

Stocks of wholesalers in the nine trades were valued $12 \%$ higher at October 31, 1950 than on the same date a year ago. This was the largest percentage increase to be recorded so far this year.

Grocery and tobacco and confectionery wholesalers were largely responsible for this gain, inventories in these trades being valued $22 \%$ and $23 \%$ respectively higher than at October 31 a year ago.

Declines in value of stocks on hand compared with a year ago were recorded by clothing wholesalers (13\%) and by fruit and vegetable wholesalers (7\%).
