# WHOLESALE TRADE <br> JULY 1950 

Sales of wholesalers in Canade in July 1950 were $10 \%$ higher in dollar volume than in July a year eco and $4 \%$ below June 1950 . Cumulative galea for the first seven months of 1950 exceeded the volume for the corresponding period of 1949 by 2\%. The general unadjusted index of wholeasle arles for the nine inner covered by this survey (on the base, average for $1935-1939=100$ ) stood at 313.5 Cor July 1950, 285.5 for July 1949, and 326.t for June 1950.

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    Oalng were recorded in July for all repions of the country and ranced between \(g\) g and \(10 \%\) in Ontario and Western Canada and between \(4 \%\) and \(7 \%\) in quebec and the Maritime.

[^0]Automotive equipment wholesalers registered the greatest gain over July 1949 with dollar sales up $25 \%$ as comparad with a $1 \%$ increase for the firet seven months of the year. Increases in hardvare, clothing, dry goods; and grocery wholesalses' sales in fuly amounted to $14 \%, 14 \%$, $15 \%$, and $13 \%$ respectively and were the largest these trades have recorded since the boginning of the ysar. After showing an incroase for the first time this yoar in June, footwoar wholesalers again recorded lower sales than in 1949, the July volume being $5 \%$ bolow that for July last yoar.

Stocks
Inventories of wholesalers at the ond of July 1950 were valued $9 \%$ highar than at the same date a year ago. Tobacco and confectionery wholesalers reported stocks $26 \%$ in excess of the inventory value at July 31, 1949, while no change was recorded in the value of stocks held by olothing wholosalers. Gains in the other trades ranged between $5 \%$ and $11 \%$ 。
