

## WHOLESALE TRADE

JULY 1950

Sales of wholesalers in Canada in July 1950 were 10% higher in dollar volume than in July a year ago and 4% below June 1950. Cumulative sales for the first seven months of 1950 exceeded the volume for the corresponding period of 1949 by 2%. The general unadjusted index of wholesale sales for the nine lines covered by this survey (on the base, average for 1935-1939=100) stood at 313.5 for July 1950, 285.5 for July 1949, and 326.4 for June 1950.

Gains were recorded in July for all regions of the country and ranged between 8% and 10% in Ontario and Western Canada and between 4% and 7% in Quebec and the Maritimes.

### Sales Trends in Individual Trades

Automotive equipment wholesalers registered the greatest gain over July 1949 with dollar sales up 25% as compared with a 1% increase for the first seven months of the year. Increases in hardware, clothing, dry goods, and grocery wholesalers' sales in July amounted to 14%, 14%, 15%, and 13% respectively and were the largest these trades have recorded since the beginning of the year. After showing an increase for the first time this year in June, footwear wholesalers again recorded lower sales than in 1949, the July volume being 5% below that for July last year.

#### Stocks

Inventories of wholesalers at the end of July 1950 were valued 9% higher than at the same date a year ago. Tobacco and confectionery wholesalers reported stocks 26% in excess of the inventory value at July 31, 1949, while no change was recorded in the value of stocks held by clothing wholesalers. Gains in the other trades ranged between 5% and 11%.
