

Wholesalers sales in September 1950 were $b \neq$ higher in dollar volume than in September a year ago but registered a drop of $5 \%$ from August 1950．Cum $\rightarrow$ uletive sales for the first nine mon the of the current year exceeded the dollar volume of the corresponding period of 1949 by $5 \%$ ．The general unadjusted index （on the tasse，averame for $1935-1939=100$ ）stood ret 352.1 for September 1950， 332.2 for Sexiember 1949，arid 365.9 for August 1950.

Sales of quebec wholesalers advanced 12 多 in September 1950 compared with September a year ago，while Ontario ark British Columbia wholeakiere reg－ istered rene of $5 \%$ and 7 名．Smaller 1 ncruabes of 4, end $1 \%$ were recorded by wholesalers in the Maritime and Prairie Provinces riepactively．

## PERCENTAGE CHANGES IN SALES AND INVENTORIES

SEPTEMBER 1950


September was the third successive month in which sales inoreases of automotive equipment and hardware wholesal ers have exceeded those of all other trades. Gains in these trades amounted to $16 \%$ and $15 \%$ in Soptember. considerably above the year-to-date increases of $7 \%$ for aut motive equipment and $4 \%$ for hardware.

The dry goods and apparel trades also recorded advances in dollar sales over September last year, oontinuing the trend which has been evident for the past three months and reflecting greater activity in the retail apparel field. Increases have not been large onough, however, to make up for declines in the early part of the year. Percentage changes in sales for these trades for September and for denuary to September (in brackets) compared with corresponding months last year were as follows: dry goods, 9\% $(-1 \%)$; clothing, $8 \%(-4 \%)$; footwear, $4 \%(-3 \%)$.

Wholesale grocers' sales in September were 4\% above Septomber last year, while drugs and tobacco and confectionery wholosalers reported sales up 2\%.

Fruit and vegetable dealers' salos were 4 lower than in Soptember 1949, but results wore not consistent for various regions of the oountry. A decrease of $14 \%$ in the Western Provinces more than offset gains in the Fast which amounted to $13 \%$ in the Maritimes and Quebec cambined and 9\% in Ontario.

## Stocks

Wholesslers in the nine trades under review reported inventories at the end of September 1950 valued $12 \%$ in excess of stocks on hand at the same date a year ago and $3 \%$ higher than at the end of August 1950. As in the past wonths, tobacco and confectionery and grocery wholesalers ${ }^{2}$ stocks showed the greatest increases, September gains being 24\% and 20\% respectively. Increases ranging between $5 \%$ and $13 \%$ were recorded for other trades with the exception of clothing wholesalers whose stocks were valued $10 \%$ lower at September 30,1950 than at September 30, 1949.
