## WHOLESALE TRADE OCTOBER, 1951

The dollar volume of sales in October 1951 was $10.5 \%$ higher than in October a year ago. The cumulative figures for the ten months were $10.9 \%$ above the sales volume for the same period of 1950.


The results shown in this report are based on returns fron some 400 wholesalers distributed over nine trades. They reflect the dollar volume of business and are not adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

The unadjusted index for the total of the nine trades (average for $1935-1939=100$ ) stood at 375 . C for October 1951 compared with $348 . C$ for the preceeding month and 339.7 for October 1950 .
utocks on hand at the end of October remained at a comparatively hieh level, $15 \%$ above the aollar volume of inventories on hand at october 31. 1950. The greatest gains in inventories over last year were in the auto parts and equipment, clothing and dary goods trades. One trade, drug wholesalers, reported inventories at the end of October slightly below the dollar volume on hand at the same date in 1950.

All trades except clothing, dry goods and footwear showed increased sales volume over October 1950. The greatest advances were in groceries with a $22 \%$ increase, drugs $17 \%$, auto parts and equipment $15 \%$ and fruits and vegetables $15 \%$ 。Clothing wholesalers showed a decline of $15 \%$ in dollar volume of sales from October 1950; they also recorded the smellest year-todate increase over 1950 at $2 \%$. hll provinces contributed to the over-all gain in sales volume with: British Columbia showing the greatest advance in index, from 388.9 in October 1950 to 453.5 in October this year.
