# WHOLESALE TRADE 

MARCH 1951

Wholesale sales in March 1951 were 14\% higher than in the same month of 1950, based on the results for nine lines of trade. This increase was more moderate than those reported for the first two months of the year. In the first quarter, sales this year were 23\% ahead of 1950 volume for the same three months.


The harch index of dollar sales was 334.5 (on the base, average for $1935-1939=100$ ), as compared with indexes of 293.4 for March 1950 and 303.1 for February 1951.

Results quoted throughout this report are based on dollar sales and have not been adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

Inventories of merchandise for the nine trades were $21 ; \%$ higher on March 31 this year compared with the same date in 1950.

The largest sales increases were those for hardware ( $31, \%$ ) and automotive wholesalers $(30 \%)$. Inventory gains for these two trades were $18 \%$ and $31 \%$ respectively. Among the more prominent sales increases were those for footwear, dry goods and clothine wholesalers, all of which had increases in excess oi the average.

Tobacco wholesalers reported the value of their inventories to be 41\% greater on larch 31 this year than on the same date in 1950, although having only a $2 ; \%$ sales increase in March.
