## WHOLESALE TRADE <br> APRIL, 1951

Dollar volume of wholesale sales in April 1951 was $23 \%$ higher than in April 1950 and $2 \%$ above March 1951 sales. Figures contained in this report are based on returns submitted by some 400 wholesalers representing nine lines of trade. No adjustment is made for changes in wholesale prices. The April gain was consistent with that for the first four months of the year, the cumulative sales for the period from January to April being $23 \%$ in excess of those for the corresponding period of 1950.


The general unadjusted index (on the base, average for 1935-1939= 100) was 340.9 for April 1951, as compared with 278.3 for April 1950 and 333.6 for March 1951.

The value of inventories in the nine trades was also $23 \%$ higher at April 30, 1951 than at the same date a year ago.

Automotive parts and accessories and hardware dealers held the lead among the nine trades in rate of increase over 1950 in April as well as in the year-to-date comparison. Automotive dealers' sales in April were $54 \%$ above fipril a year ago, while hardware wholesalers' sales rose $42 \%$. Stocks on hand at the end of April were up $33 \%$ in the automotive trade and $24 \%$ in the wholesale hardware trade.

Increases in sales of $26 \%$ and $25 \%$ over kpril 1950 were recorded by tobacco and confectionery wholesalers and by dry goods wholesalers, while inventories in these trades rose $12 \%$ and $20 \%$ respectively in value.

Fruit and vegetable wholesalers' sales were $2, \%$ lower in April this year than in April a year ago, with stocks on hand at April 30 valued $6 \%$ higher.
