## WHOLESALE TRADE <br> MAY, 1951

Sales of wholesalers in May 1951 were 12\% higher then in May a year ago and $6 \%$ above April 1951 volume. The May increase was the lowest among those for the first five months of this year. Increases for earlier months of 1951 were as follows: January, 33\%; February, 24\%; March, 14\%; and April, 23\%. Sales in the January-to-May period were $20 \%$ above those for the same five months of 1950.

Figures in this report are based on returns from some 400 wholesalers representing nine trades. They indicate trends in dollar volume of business, no adjustment having been made for changes in wholesale prices.

## PERCENTAGE CHANGES IN SALES AND INVENTORIES



The general unadjusted index (on the base, average for 1935-1939 = 100) stood at 361.0 for May 1951, as compared with 321.5 for Hay 1950 and 340.9 for April 1951.

Wholesalers stocks were valued $26 \%$ higher at May 31, 1951 than at the corresponding date a year ago.

Hardware and automotive parts and equipment wholesalers again registered the greatest increases in dollar sales over a year ago. Gains of $23 \%$ recorded for these trades in May were considerably smaller than those for the five-month period from January to May when hardware wholesalers' sales were up 39\% and those of automotive parts and equipment dealers were $42 \%$ above the corresponding period of 1950. Stocks in the hands of hardware wholesalers were $27 \%$ above the value at May 31, 1950, while automotive parts and equipment wholesalers invontories were up $35 \%$.

Sales of footwear wholesalers rose $19 \%$ over Nay a year ago as compared with the five-month cumulative gain of 29, Footwear inventories were up 26\%. Wholesale grocers' sales advanced $14 \%$ and inventories, $31 \%$ 。 A gain of $12 \%$ was registered in sales of dry goods wholesalers as compared with a $25 \%$ increase for the year to date. Drug, clothine, and fruit and vegetable wholesalers reported sales up $10 \%$, $6 \%$, and $5 \%$ respectively in way.

A $6 \%$ decrease in sales of tobacco and confectionery wholesalers followed a $25 \%$ gain reported in April. The year-to-date increase over 1950 amounted to $10 \%$. Stocks on hand were valued $15 \%$ higher than at the end of May a year ago.

Among the various regions, British Columbia registered the greatest increase in total wholesale sales with a gain of 18, over hay 1950. The Prairie Provinces, Quebec, and Ontario followed with sales up $13 \%, 12 \%$ and $11 \%$ respectively, while a gain of $5 \%$ was recorded for tho liaritime Provinces.
