# WHOLESALE TRADE 

JUNE, 1951

Sales of wholesalers in June 1951 exceeded the June, 1950 volume by $5 \%$ but were $5 \%$ below sales in May 1951. These figures are based on statements submitted by some 400 firms representing nine lines of trade. The June increase over a year ago was considerably lower than that of $17 \%$ registered for the first six months of 1951 over the corresponding period of 1950. The general unadjusted index (on the base, average for $1935-1939=100$ ) stood at 343.0 for June 1951, 326.4 for June 1950, and 361.7 for May 1951.

Stocks in the hands of wholesalers at the end of June 1951 were valued $24 \%$ higher than at June 30, 1950.


Increases in sales for various regions of the country varied only slightly from the Canada average of $5 \%$ except for British Columbia where a gain of ll\％in dollar volume of wholesale sales was recorded．

Automotive parts and equipment wholesalers again registered the greatest increase among the individual trades，with sales up $17 \%$ over June a year ago，but the June gain was considerably lower than the $37 \%$ increase for the first half of 1951 compared with the corresponding period of 1950．Stocks of automotive whole－ salers were valued $37 \%$ higher than at June 30 ，1950．Hardware wholesalers，which had shared with automotive wholesalers the lead in amount of percentage increase for the past several months，reported sales up only $7 \%$ over June 1950 as compared with a $32 \%$ increase for the year to date。 The value of hardware wholesalers＇inven－ tories was $27 \%$ in excess of the total a year previously．

Grocery wholesalers＇sales were up $\mathbf{1 1 \%}$ ，and stocks $25 \%$ ，compared with totals for June 1950．A cain of $9 \%$ in sales，and of $31 \%$ in stocks was reported by footwear wholesalers．Smaller gains of $5 \%$ and $2 \%$ occurred in sales of drug and tobacco and confectionery wholesalers respectively．

Sales of fruit and vegetable wholesalers dropped $6 \%$ below the volume of sales in June l．950，with the six－month curnulative sales $2 \%$ above the first six months of 1950.

Decreases were recorded by dry goods wholesalers and clothing wholesalers for the first time this year．Sales of the former were $8 \%$ below those for June last year while stocks were valued $26 \%$ higher．A decrease of $12 \%$ in sales was registered by clothing wholesalers，with stocks in this trade valued $24 \%$ above June 30,1950 。 Sales during the first half of the year were $19 \%$ higher in the case of dry goods wholesalers and $12 \%$ greater for clothing wholesalers than in the first half of 1950 。
