

WHOLESALE TRADE

AUGUST, 1951

Wholesale trade in August was 2% lower, in dollar volume, than in the same month of last year. This decrease is the first for 1951 in monthly comparisons with last year. Cumulative figures for the first eight months showed sales up 13% over the same period of 1950.



About 400 wholesalers, distributed over nine trades, supply figures upon which this report is based.

The general unadjusted index (on the base, average for 1935-1939=100) stood at 361.9 for August 1951, as compared with 368.9 for August 1950 and 328.9 for July 1951.

Stocks remained at a comparatively high level, 24% above the dollar volume of inventories held at the end of August 1950.

Wholesalers in footwear, drugs and fruits and vegetables enjoyed a more active trade in August than was the case with those in the other six trades. Five of the nine trades showed sales declines from August a year ago, the largest being that for dry goods wholesalers, 14%.

Inventories were higher than last year in all nine trades with particularly marked gains (30% or over) in auto parts and equipment, clothing, dry goods, fruits and vegetables and hardware.

Sales moved downward in August in all sections of the country except British Columbia.
