# WHOLESALE TRADE <br> MARCH 1952 

The results shown in this report are based on returns from 400 wholesalers distributed over nine trades. They reflect trends in dollar volume of business and are not adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

The unad justed index for the total of the nine trades (on the base of $1935-1939=100$ ) stood at 333.7 for March 1952 compared with 338.9 for March a year ago and 313.5 for February 1952.

Sales Trends by Trades
March sales of wholesalers in the trades covered by this survey declined slightly from March last year. The greatest drop occurred in the clothing trade where wholesalers reported a decrease of $15 \%$ in sales from March 1951. Wholesale sales of dry goods, footwear and hardware continued to decline. Wholesalers of fruits and vegetables reported the greatest increase in sales$13 \%$ above March a year ago. Sales of auto parts and equipment increased $9 \%$, while grocery and tobacco and confectionery sales were $2 \%$ higher than in the same perind last year.

## Inventories

Inventories at the end of March were down $6 \%$ from the same date last year. Tobacco and confectionery wholesalers with a decrease of $40 \%$ recorded the greatest drop in stocks from March 1951. Decreases in stocks were recorded in all trades except fruits and vegetables and hardware. Wholesalers of fruits and vegetables recorded a $9 \%$ increase while stocks of hardware wholesalers were $2 \%$ higher than at the end of March a year ago.
