## WHOLESALE TRADE

JUNE 1952

The results shown in this report are based on returns from 400 wholesalers distri ute over nine trades. They reflect trends in dollar volume of business and are not adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

The unadjusted index for the total of the nine trades (on the base of $1935-1939=100$ ) stood at 369.2 for June 1952 compared with 357.3 for June a year ago and 390.3 for May 1952.

June salas of wholesalers in the trades covered by this survey were $3 \%$ higher than in June last year. Wholesalers of fruits and vegetables with increased sales of $19 \%$ recorded the gre test gain over June 1951. Sales of auto parts and equipment and clothing increased $16 \%$ and 12\% respectively. Smaller by wholesalers or drugs and tobacco and confectionery. Sales of hardware with a decline of 4 registered the greatest drop from June 1951. Slight decreases in sales were also reported by wolesalers of footwear, groceries and dry goods.

## Inventories

Inventories at the end of June declined $7 \%$ from the same date last year. The rreatest drop occurred in the clothing trade which reported a decline of $27 \%$ in strocks from the end of June 1951. Decreases in inventories were recorded in all trades except fruits and vegetables and drugs. Stocks of fruits and vegetables rose $11 \%$ while stocks of drugs were $4 \%$ higher than at the end of June a year ago.
