## WHOLESALE TRADE



The results shown in this report are based on returns from 400 wholesalers distributed over nine trades. They reflect trends in dollar volume of business and are not adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

The unadjusted index for the total of the nine trades (on the base of 1935-1939=100) stood at 376.0 for July 1952 compared with 338.7 for July a year ago and 368.5 for June 1952.

Wholessle sales continued upward in July, with wholesalers in the trades covered by this survey reporting an increase of $10 \%$ over sales in July last year. Wholesalers of fruits and vegetables again registered the greatest gain in sales - $26 \%$ over July 1951. Sales of auto parts and equipment and footwear increased $20 \%$ and $16 \%$ respectively. Wholesslers of drugs and groceries reported gains of $12 \%$ and $10 \%$, while smaller increases of $6 \%$ and $5 \%$ were reported by wholesalers of tobacco and confectionery, clothing, and hardware. Sales of dry goods, with a drop of $4 \%$, registered the only decline in sales over July 1951.

## Inventories

Inventories at the end of July were $6 \%$ lower than at the same date last year. Clothing wholesalers, with a decline of $32 \%$, recorded the greatest drop in stocks from the end of July 1951. Decreases in stocks were reported by all trades except drugs and groceries. Stocks of drugs rose 40 while grocery inventories were slightly higher than at the end of June last year.
